

## New Edition of Florida Building Code in 2021 – Vesting Development Approvals under Old Code

On January 1, 2021, the 6<sup>th</sup> Edition of the Florida Building Code will be replaced with the 7<sup>th</sup> Edition. This will affect all regulated construction projects that have not been permitted by respective jurisdictions by December 31, 2020.

If you have an existing development approval, <u>but have not yet submitted for permitting</u>, now is the time to do so in order to vest the plans under the 6<sup>th</sup> Edition. Cities and counties are handling the transition in several ways. Most jurisdictions require <u>the permit application to be accepted and the building permit fee to be paid in full</u> by December 31 in order to vest under the 6th Edition. The City of Clearwater Building Official, Kevin Garriott, has specifically indicated that the permit <u>application</u> date will determine the applicable code, and if "substantial design efforts" are shown under a previous code, consideration may be made on a case-by-case basis into 2021 as well.
